<p>Ordinal numbers is a number that tells the position of something in a list, such as 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th etc. Can you talk about the position of the boats and cars in these pictures? Try to use the ordinal numbers you have learnt. You could use a story map, like one below to help or draw your own. You could also use puppets or story cut outs to help you.</p>	<p>Can you design something special for Father's Day using technology? You could design a card, write a poem, make a presentation as to why they are so special or record a special message. You could use Jit5, Purple mash, iMovie , picollage or any other app you want to use.</p> <p>I have set a template on Purple mash as a template if you would like to use that.</p>	<p>Can you find some similarities and differences between where Handa lives and where we live? You could think about what animals are there, what things are growing and what people are wearing, how the houses different to ours. You could record what you think on a table like the one below using words or pictures.</p> <p>Can you have a go at making a house like in the story? You could draw, paint, or make a model. You could also use outdoor resources to help you, like mud, sticks and grass. Here are some pictures to help you.</p>
<p>Find any of the fruit in Handa's surprise or any fruit/vegetables you have at home. With help from a grown up, can you cut the fruit into halves? Can you cut the fruit into quarters? Can you make it into a whole again? Are the fruits symmetrical? Can you see any patterns on the fruit?</p>	<p>First read the powerpoint below about alliteration. Can you describe the animals or fruit in the story using alliteration? You could write 2 or 3 words or full sentences.</p>	<p>Can you move your body to be like some of the animals in the story? Alliteration is when 2 or more words start with the same sound.

peppers.

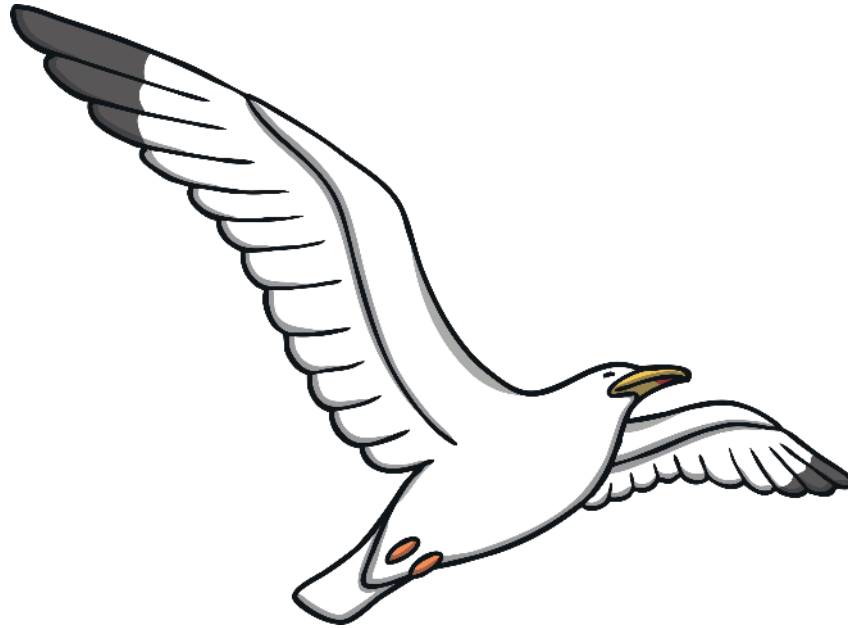


In the first one, all the words start with the 's' sound.

because (always give reasons for your ideas)

To agree/disagree you could say

I agree with ... because

I disagree with.... because

To further your discussion you can add to someone's point by saying 'Building on your point...'

You can also challenge another member of your discussion by asking questions,

Am I right in thinking...?

What do you mean when you say...?

Can you explain...?

At the end of your discussion can you 'summarise' what has been said and make a conclusion.
